- Row 18 (RS): k5, m1right, s2kp, m1left, k4
- Row 17 (WS): p5, sl wyif, p6
- Row 16 (RS): k5, yo, sk2p, yo, k4
- Row 15 (WS): p4, sl wyif, p1, sl wyif, p5
- Row 14 (RS): k4, yo, ssk, k1, k2tog, yo, k3
- Row 13 (WS): p3, sl wyif, p3, sl wyif, p4
- Row 12 (RS): k3, yo, ssk, k3, k2tog, yo, k2
- Row 11 (WS): p2, sl wyif, p5, sl wyif, p3
- Row 10 (RS): k2, yo, ssk, k5, k2tog, yo, k1
- Row 9 (WS): p1, sl wyif, p7, sl wyif, p2
- Row 8 (RS): k1, yo, k2tog, k7, ssk, yo
- Row 7 (WS): p1, sl wyif, p7, sl wyif, p2
- Row 6 (RS): k1, yo, k2tog, k2, yo, s2kp, yo, k2, ssk, yo
- Row 5 (WS): p1, [sl wyif, p3] twice, sl wyif, p2
- Row 4 (RS): k1, yo, k2tog, k2, yo, s2kp, yo, k2, ssk, yo
- Row 3 (WS): p1, [sl wyif, p3] twice, sl wyif, p2
- Row 2 (RS): k1, yo, k2tog, k2, yo, s2kp, yo, k2, ssk, yo
- Row 1 (WS): p1, [sl wyif, p3] twice, sl wyif, p2

Casita

Legend:

- knit
knit stitch
- ▽ slip
Slip stitch as if to purl, holding yarn in back
- yo
Yarn Over
- ▧ k2tog
Knit two stitches together as one stitch
- Λ Slip 2, Knit, Pass
Slip 2 stitches knitwise, knit 1, pass 2 slip stitches over
- ssk
Slip one stitch as if to knit, Slip another stitch as if to purl. Insert left-hand needle into front of these 2 stitches and knit them together
- ▨ sl1 kwise k2tog pss0
sl1 kwise, k2tog, pss0
- MR make 1 right
Insert left needle from back to front under the strand before next st. Knit to close.
- M make 1 left
Insert left needle from front to back under the strand before next st. Knit thru the back loop to close.



Blog Bonus: Casita Stitch Scarf Draft

If I had time, this is what I would do with the Casita stitch pattern. I haven't swatched it or tested it so you'll have to go with the flow. Use a yarn with good stitch definition and not too much color variation. Start with Judy's Magic Cast On and work from the center out.



hatch stitch

sl1, yo, k1, pss0 over last 2 sts.
